PROGRAM INFORMATION

The SD46 Youth Fire Academy is a Work Experience 12 program offering students an incredible opportunity to explore the exciting field of firefighting. This equal opportunity program is open to all grade 11 and 12 students in SD46, including those in the SPIDER program. Participants will be challenged in their strength, endurance, communication, and teamwork skills as they engage in activities such as dragging charged hose lines, extinguishing live fires, laddering buildings, gaining certifications, fighting wildfires, and using the "Jaws of Life" to cut through cars.

Fourteen (14) Cadets will be deeply immersed in an 8-day program, which includes both classroom instruction and practical exercises. The Academy will cover the physical and educational components of Firefighter Basic Training for new recruits. Skills will be taught collaboratively by firefighters and officers from local fire and wildfire departments, providing students with access to a wealth of experience.

Firefighters must maintain a high level of fitness to perform their duties effectively. Turnout gear, tools, and breathing apparatus add approximately 23 kilograms to the wearer. Successful applicants will need to work in teams while wearing this heavy and hot life-saving gear. Previous experience in sports and a commitment to physical training will be beneficial.

The Academy will be held at the Sechelt Fire Department (5525 Trail Ave, Sechelt), the Training Yard (5940 Mason Rd), and the Sechelt Fire Base (4448 Hilltop Rd). The program concludes with a "Family Day," where friends and family can watch a live demonstration of the skills and knowledge acquired during the program, followed by food and certificate presentations.

Cadets will be selected through a process evaluating a range of strengths and weaknesses, including academic performance, physical fitness, and interview results. Successful candidates will show strong academic abilities, excellent school attendance, relevant work or volunteer experience, and diverse interests. Those with a genuine interest in firefighting, forestry, paramedicine, military, or police services will particularly benefit from this Academy.

The SD46 Youth Fire Academy is dedicated to providing a unique opportunity to explore the fire service and its many benefits. This program is limited to fourteen (14) cadets to ensure a high instructor-to-student ratio and a safe, immersive learning environment.

REQUIREMENTS

The Youth Fire Academy is open to any current grade 11 or 12 student who is registered in an SD46 Sunshine Coast high school, SPIDER, or home school program.

Applicants must meet the following criteria to be considered:

- Be 16 years of age by December 31, 2025
- Have a genuine interest in firefighting, volunteering and community service
- Have a good attendance and late record
- Be willing and able to work as part of a team
- Can communicate effectively
- Be physically fit and healthy
- Be a non-smoker during the program
- Relinquish the use of personal devices during the hours of the program
- Strictly adhere to the Sechelt Fire Department dress code

FITNESS INFORMATION

For those that are not on a regular fitness regime, i.e. working out at least twice a week or playing organized sports, it is highly recommended that you start exercising now. Passing the run, push-up and sit- up test may get you into the program but only those who actively participate in a healthy lifestyle (including working out) will have the stamina to make it through the eight (8) intense days of the program.

PERSONAL INTERVIEW PREPARATION

The interview will take place in at the end of January, and you are expected to act and dress as you would for a real job interview. **Please bring an updated resume with you to your interview**.

There will be a small panel (three or four people) from local fire departments. BC Wildfire, and SD46 interviewing you.

During your interview you may/will be asked about:

- Your school courses and grades
- Your attendance/lates... especially if you excessive lates or absences (i.e. more than 5, ideally no unexcused)
- Past/present employment, volunteer and or sports activities (including fitness testing results)
- Key points from: Who am I?, updated resume, and letter of intent
- Your future career and education plans
- Your hobbies and activities

ACCIDENT AND LIABILITY INSURANCE

Parents/Guardians:

As part of the Youth Fire Academy, your son/daughter/ward will also be enrolled in a Work Experience 12A/B 'online' course that is organized and monitored by Cheryl Wilson, an SD46 teacher.

Usually, Work Experience placements are made with many different employers and organizations throughout the Lower Mainland (ex: retail store, accounting firm, florist, care home). Worksites are considered either Standard or Non-Standard under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A **Standard Work Site** is a location at which a worker carries out career related tasks and responsibilities under the general supervision of a work-site employer. It also applies to a situation of self-employment. This Standard work site is covered by the Workers' Compensation Act.

A **Non-standard Work Site** is a location created by a school or school board for training students for an occupation or career, or an existing public or private training institution in which a student is placed for training purposes. **Workers' Compensation Board coverage does <u>NOT</u> apply on a Non-standard work site.**

Important Note:

For the purposes of this Youth Fire Academy, this work experience worksite is considered Non-standard.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Students will show up on time and ready for the day dressed in their complete uniform and applicable personal protection equipment (PPE)
- 2. Students must follow all directions from fire hall staff and SD46 personnel, including all safety protocols set by Department Procedures and WorkSafeBC
- 3. Any injury that occurs on Sechelt Fire Department and BC Wildfire Service property must be reported (regardless of how minor)
- 4. All assigned homework will be handed in at the beginning of class
- 5. Alcohol, cannabis and non-prescription drugs are strictly prohibited during the Youth Academy
 - a. prescription drugs should be documented on the APPLICANT MEDICAL INFORMATION FORM and reported to the instructor prior to the beginning of class
- 6. Smoking of any kind (cigarettes, e-cigarettes/vaping or chewing tobacco) is not permitted during the program
- 7. Students are not to enter out-of-bounds areas. These will be identified on the first day of class
- 8. Students are responsible for their uniform and all equipment assigned to them during the program
- 9. No jewelry or piercings are to be worn during the program. They can get entangled during training exercises and cause serious injuries
- 10. Watches are required for first aid training
- 11. Long hair must be retained during training
- 12. Nail polish and makeup are not to be worn
- 13. All students must be clean shaven. Trimmed mustaches are acceptable but goatees, beards and sideburns below the ears are not acceptable.
- 14. Personal electronic devices (phones, iPads, laptops, Apple watches, etc.) are not permitted during the instructional parts of the program. Students may use them before and after the day's program, and during their lunch period.

PARENT WAIVER AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

The School District 46 (SD46) Youth Fire Academy (the "Academy") is a work experience program that introduces students to firefighting theory and practical skills, including fire hose drags and carries, setting up and climbing an aerial ladder/bucket, fire extinguisher training, climbing a training tower in firefighting gear, extinguishing multiple types of fires, fire pumper vehicle activities, auto extrication training (e.g., cutting cars, removing glass, vehicle stabilization) and using other firefighting equipment. The Academy will be hosted by the Sechelt Fire Department (the "Dept") and BC Wildfire ("BCWS").

The Academy is designed to provide challenges and skill-building opportunities and includes several activities with inherent risks that are different or greater than those normally assumed at home or school. Risks related to use of Fire/Rescue grounds and equipment, slipping, tripping, falling from a height, being struck by falling objects, improper use or failure of equipment, over-exertion, cuts, exhaustion, inclement weather, impact or collision with equipment or persons and negligence or unauthorized activities of others. While the Dept. takes reasonable safety precautions, it is not possible to eliminate all risk.

Participants are required to wear all safety gear and strictly comply with all instructions and directions provided by Fire/Rescue staff and other Academy facilitators. Participants must share responsibility for their own safety and that of others during the Academy and are encouraged to seek clarification regarding safety or any other matter at any time.

In consideration of the Dept. allowing the student named below (the "**Participant**") to participate in the Academy, the Participant's parent or legal guardian (the "**Parent**") hereby:

This Consent and Acknowledgment of Risk is governed by and will be construed in accordance with the laws of the Province of British Columbia.


